Junk Mail

Newspaper
Office, computer, notebook & gift-wrap paper
Pizza boxes without the inside tray
Soda & beer can carrying cases

(All containers must be rinsed clean)

Plastics #1 - 5, 7

Detergent & fabric softener containers
Health & beauty aid containers

Kitty litter containers *(5-gallon max.)*
Margarine tubs & frozen desert cups
