## Mayor's Message

I am honored and humbled to be writing this letter as your recently elected Mayor. Over our thirty years as residents of Lake Forest, my family and I have come to love this exceptional community, with

its truly amazing quality of life and small town culture, combined with its world class institutions and stunning beauty.

First, a huge thank you to all my predecessors, but especially to former Mayor Rob Lansing. Rob has ably led Lake Forest through several challenges these past two years, and I inherit this role with the City in a very strong position. Due to Rob's willingness to lead the City Council to deal head-on with important issues, including the creation of a practical plan to address the City's pension obligations, we can now focus the agenda on long-term strategy.

Our normal repaving activity will be compounded by the construction of the Hughes Gateway North Beach Access Road, as well as storm sewer and

water main replacements at the intersection of Old Elm and Timber Lane. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the people working on these improvements to our community when you encounter the inevitable inconveniences that will occur. That is the Lake Forest way.

Summer will also bring a multitude of wonderful events for all to enjoy. ## "Change of the Guard"

At the May 22 City Council meeting, the annual "Change of the Guard" took place as Mayor Lansing retired from service and Third Ward Alderman Jack Reisenberg's term ended. Both were recognized and applauded for their dedicated leadership and faithful volunteer service to

The City of Lake Forest. In Session II of the meeting, Mayor George A. Pandaleon and Third Ward Alderman Ara Goshgarian were sworn into office.

Mr. Pandaleon earned a Master of Business Administration degree from Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Management, and a Bachelor of Arts degree from Kenyon College.

He is a former board member of the National Association of Real Estate Investment Managers. He is also an active member of the Pension Real Estate Association, the International Council of Shopping Centers, the Urban Land Institute, and holds a FINRA Series 65 securities license.

Mr. Pandaleon has served the City of Lake Forest in numerous appointed and elected roles for more than 25 years. From May, 2011 through April, 2017 he was an Alderman and Chairman of the Lake Forest City Council Finance Committee. He recently received the Lawrence J. Temple Community Service Award; the highest civic honor bestowed on Lake Forest citizens.

Ara has lived in Lake Forest most of his life. He attended Everett School, Deerpath and Lake Forest High School. He then attended Carroll College, The University of Illinois (D.D.S.) and completed his orthodontic specialty program (Loyola University-orthodontic certification).

Dr. Goshgarian returned to Lake Forest with his wife and four children to practice orthodontics with his father and has been in the community ever since. His children are currently attending and have attended both Districts 67 and 115 schools.

He is a Past-President of both The Illinois Society of Orthodontists and The Midwestern Society of Orthodontists. He is currently serving on The Council on Governmental Affairs and has served on several other commissions and boards; most notably the AAO's House of Delegates, which has financial, policy and bylaw oversight over his professional organization. He has done so over the last 17 years.

Ara has served on the Lake Forest Caucus, firmly believing the mechanism of the Caucus best serves the community. He is a current member of The Friends of Lake Forest Parks and Recreation Board, serving as Vice-president. Additionally, he is working with Alderman Tim Newman and Alderman Prue Beidler on the Deerpath Golf Course renovation project. Ara looks forward to expanding his community service as 3rd Ward Alderman.

Construction Updates. During these improvements, the City appreciates your patience and understanding.

Some upcoming Lake Forest projects include:

- North Beach Access Road: Lake Road between Westminster and Deerpath is closed. The project has begun and will continue until September 15, 2019. The roadway will be reconstructed so that it is farther away from the bluff, and the existing bluff will be stabilized. Also, the north beach parking lot will be reconstructed. Beach parking is detailed on pages 8.
- Maintenance work will take place on the Deerpath railroad crossing between Western Avenue and McKinley Road for approximately two weeks in August. The City will keep residents informed once these dates are confirmed.
- Old Elm Road and Timber Lane Storm Sewer/Forest Hill Road Watermain Replacement: The project is estimated to take place from June 10-August 31. Please note that Old Elm Road will be closed from Green Bay Road to Timber Lane during this time.




## "Providing a Future for All Generations": A Strategic Planning Update

- Adoption and implementation of Comprehensive Parks and Recreation Master Plan to drive continual growth and improvement of open space, facilities, parks and recreation system, and services and ensure continued success for current and future Lake Forest residents.
- Successful land transfer of City-owned property to Lake Forest Open Lands Association for enhancement and completion of the McCormick Ravine Restoration Project to help restore, stabilize and preserve invaluable ravines and bluffs across the shorelines of Lake Forest.
- Completion of the City's historic Market Square East Side (CBD) Train Station Renovation Project along with the Lake Forest Preservation Foundation to improve safety, economic viability, and better serve nearly 1,000 daily commuters with modern amenities as well as to preserve the station's historic integrity for future generations.

## Your Property Taxes

### 2019 Quadrennial Assessment Information

Per State Statute, General Assessment Years, also called Quadrennial Years, occur every four years. During those years, local township assessors must reassess every parcel in their townships, regardless of age, location, size or value of improvements. Now is a good time for Lake Foresters to personally take stock of properties and determine if assessed values are accurate. There are several ways to do this:

- Look at the property record "blue card" on file in the local township assessor's office to be sure that everything is correct.
- Compare your assessment to assessments of like properties in the area
- Talk with your township assessor about your concerns.

## MetraMore

Enhanced train service at the Telegraph Road Train Station, "MetraMore", launched on March 4. Metra has partnered with business and civic groups in Lake County, including The City of Lake Forest, to pilot a two-year project for expanded rush hour commuter service on the Milwaukee District North Line. Other partners include Abbvie, Horizon Pharma, Lake County Partners, Trustmark Insurance, Northwestern Medicine Lake Forest Hospital, Tenneco, and the Village of Deerfield.

The morning and afternoon train schedule has been improved to accommodate rush hour riders. A new out-bound express train departs Union Station in Chicago at 6:25 a.m. and arrives in Lake Forest at 7:15 a.m. In the afternoon, express service leaves the Lake Forest station at 5:09 p.m. and 5:35 p.m. and arrives at Union Station in about 50 minutes or less. The expanded service makes it easier for local businesses to attract and retain talent and draw from the diverse workforce living in Chicago. West Lake Forest is home to over 30 industry-leading companies, with over 200,000 employees working within a 5-mile radius of the Telegraph Road Train Station.

MetraMore also benefits Lake Foresters during the weekday morning rush hour by: 1) adding a new morning inbound train; and, 2) modifying an existing morning inbound train to provide express service. Lake Forest residents will also be able to take advantage of the service to quickly get to Chicago during peak hours.




# SUMMER FUN GUIDE



## BEACH ROAD ACCESS & PARKING SUMMER 2019

Due to the reconstruction of the North Beach Access Road and Bluff, road access and Forest Park Beach parking will be limited for summer 2019. Visit our website for detailed information at [www.LFParksandRec.com](http://www.LFParksandRec.com).

Road access near Forest Park Beach will be limited as follows:

- No left turn permitted at Lake Road and E. Deerpath.
- No access to Ring Road at Forest Park.

Summer 2019 Forest Park Beach parking will be limited to the south beach lot with the following criteria:

### WEEKDAYS

- South Beach Parking available to all residents with a City of Lake Forest vehicle sticker.
- Middle row parking reserved for trailer, compound, and watercraft permits.
- Non-residents will be directed to park at the East Train Station.

### WEEKENDS & HOLIDAYS

- At 9:00 am, first priority parking will go to south beach access (as space is available) and watercraft permitted vehicles.
- Lower south beach parking lot will be open to all residents with a City of Lake Forest vehicle sticker from 6:00 am – 9:00 am and from 5:00 pm to close to accommodate residents walking in the morning or enjoying dinner or the evening hours at the beach.
- Middle row parking is reserved for trailers.
- Lake Forest Residents: Vehicles with a City of Lake Forest sticker must park in the lot behind Deerpath Middle School. Shuttle service provided to and from the south beach parking lot continuously from 9 am - 7 pm.
- Non-Residents: Parking will be available at the Deerpath Middle School lot after the non-resident fee is paid at the Recreation Center and a wrist band is obtained. Shuttle service provided to and from the south beach parking lot continuously from 9 am - 7 pm. Non-residents may also park at the East LF Train Station.
- Once the season is underway, adjustments may be made. If it becomes clear that the lower south parking lot has space availability on the weekends and holiday, parking may be opened up to residents with City of Lake Forest vehicle stickers. Overflow parking will remain at Deerpath Middle School.

### 4TH OF JULY

- Shuttle service available ONLY at Lake Forest High School East Campus Lot.

### ADDITIONAL NOTES

- For family safety, please be aware that the south lot is typically reserved for boaters and there are cranes and other heavy equipment being used to launch boats. Stick together and make sure everyone in your group is aware of their surroundings.



## Restoration Project: Barrell Memorial Gateway



Lake Forest Cemetery has begun restoration of the Barrell Memorial Gateway in anticipation of the 100th anniversary of the Gateway's dedication. Following an intensive vetting process, the Cemetery has contracted with Brush Architects, a preservation architecture firm, to investigate and create a preservation plan for the restoration of the iron gates and masonry structure of the Barrell Memorial Gateway on Lake Road. Berglund Construction was awarded the bid for the work. The restoration process is currently underway and includes the repointing of the gate masonry and repair of damaged stones. The gateway restoration project is expected to be completed in July 2019.

The stately Barrell Memorial Gate was dedicated in 1919 as a lasting memorial to Grace and Finley Barrell's only



son, John Witbeck Barrell. Twenty-three year old John, a 1915 graduate of Yale University, drowned in the Illinois River near the family's summer home in Havana, Illinois in July 1916.

The Gothic-style gate of striated limestone, set in an ashlar pattern, was designed by architect James Roy Allen, and

the wrought iron gates were created by the renowned artist-blacksmith, Samuel Yellin of Philadelphia. Three images are depicted on the gates: the Angel of Truth, the Angel of Light, and Saint Peter, whose figure serves as the doorknocker.

The cemetery, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, began operating in the mid-19th century.



### Spring Flowers at the Cemetery

Lake Forest Cemetery offers an annual flower planting service for families in sections where above-ground monuments are allowed and start at \$135.00 depending on the size of the family monument. Annual sun and shade pots are available for areas where in-ground plantings are not allowed. An order form can also be completed by family members who would like the Cemetery staff to clean the memorials on the family grave site. Planting will commence after June 1. City crews will pick up yard waste that is placed in store-brand kraft paper bags if a City of Lake Forest yard waste sticker has been placed on the bag. The stickers need to be placed on each bag to be collected at the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day. Stickers are \$1 (sold in sheets of five) and can be purchased at Sunset Foods, Jewel, Pasquesi Home and Gardens, Lake Forest Hardware, The Fresh Market, City Hall, and the Municipal Services Building. There cannot be any contaminants such as planter containers, dirt, sod or refuse material mixed with the yard waste material.

**Reminder:** The City will pick up bundles of brush if a City of Lake Forest yard waste sticker has been affixed to each bundle of brush placed at the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day. There is no limit to the number of bundles permitted on each collection day. Each branch in the bundle should not exceed six inches in diameter or four feet in length. Multiple branches must be tied in bundles with string or twine. Each bundle should not exceed four feet in length or two feet in width. For removal of larger amounts of unbundled brush, please contact the Forestry Section at 847.810.3564. There is a fee associated with the collection of unbundled brush or for tree limbs larger than six inches in diameter.


