


**State Street Miyabe Maple** Acer miyabei 'Morton'

Uniform broad to oval shade tree. Corky bark. Lustrous dark green



Quercus bicolor Wonderful large, shade tree. Adaptable to clay soil, prefers moist areas.



Northern Pin Oak Quercus ellipsoidalis

Horizontal branching structure. No inherent chlorosis problems.




## **Black Maple**


Acer nigrum Native species related to Sugar Maple, with greater heat and drought resistance. Best in part shade.



Magnolia x loebneri 'Merrill' Attractive tree with profuse white flowers and outstanding fragrance.



An inspiring specimen when mature. Sharp toothed, dark green leaves. A good choice for alkaline soil.



Beautiful accent tree best planted when small. Heart-shaped leaves. Delicate rose-pink in spring.



Magnificent. In a variety of conditions grows slowly to majestic proportions; needs a large area.



Spread: 15-25'
