



YOUTH IN GOVERNMENT

The City of Lake Forest offers an opportunity to youth who are residents of Lake Forest to have a unique experience with their local government by serving on a board or commission. Civic-minded students who will be high school juniors or seniors during their year of service are appointed by the Lake Forest Mayor and work alongside other community volunteers whose dedicated work continues to ensure that Lake Forest remain a special place. This involvement with their local government helps them develop lifelong leadership and business skills.

The first step for a student interested in serving the City in an appointed position is to complete a Youth Volunteer Profile Sheet. Profile Sheets may be obtained from the Office of the City Manager at Lake Forest City Hall (220 E. Deerpath). Completed Profile Sheets should be returned to City Hall. The Profile Sheets for individuals appointed to City positions become public information and are filed at City Hall.

To accompany the completed Profile Sheet, students applying for an appointment are required to submit a one-page essay explaining why they would like to serve and what benefits they and the City will derive from this experience. Two letters of reference should also be provided.

Upon submitting an application and letters of recommendation, interested students will be interviewed by a representative of the City and past youth volunteers.
