**Re: Amtrak Stop at 911 Telegraph Road, Lake Forest, IL**

Dear Mr. Schacter,

The City of Lake Forest, in conjunction with a number of Lake County businesses and municipalities, respectfully requests that IDOT authorize a stop at the Lake Forest Telegraph Road Train Station for Hiawatha Amtrak service trains. Subject to this authorization, The City will work with IDOT and other appropriate agencies, including WisDot, to implement a phased-in service effective July 1, 2015.

**The City of Lake Forest has received widespread regional support for the proposed Amtrak stop** from the Lake County Transportation Alliance, comprised of both public and private organizations, U.S. Senators Richard Durbin and Mark Kirk, U.S. Congressman Brad Schneider, State Senator Julie Morrison, State Representatives Carol Sente and Scott Drury, former State Senator Susan Garrett, former State Representative Karen May and Lake County Board Chairman Aaron Lawler. The City has received overwhelming support from the Cities of Highland Park and North Chicago, as well as the Villages of Bannockburn, Deerfield, Glenview, Lake Bluff, Libertyville, Lincolnshire, Mettawa, Northbrook and Vernon Hills. Lake County businesses and institutions have also endorsed our efforts. These include Lake Forest College, Northwestern Lake Forest Hospital, Naval Station Great Lake, Aon Hewitt and Brunswick. For your convenience, attached are copies of the numerous letters of support.

As you know, **currently there is no Amtrak stop in Lake County, Illinois**. The closest stops are Glenview to the south and Sturtevant, Wisconsin to the north. A Lake County Amtrak stop in the western Lake County region would promote economic development and strengthen regional businesses through enhanced employee recruitment and retention. Further, it would present a valuable commuting alternative for employees who work at office parks, hospitals, colleges, schools and small businesses, as well as offering Lake County residents, the Naval Station Great Lakes recruits, personnel and their families as well as college students more convenient access to national Amtrak service.

To accommodate the approximate 60,000 employees in the region, many of whom reside in Wisconsin, Illinois business could be better served by utilizing existing rail infrastructure and commuter services to

more efficiently meet the needs of its workforce. An Amtrak stop would represent a continuation of efforts started in 2006 by former State Senator Susan Garrett and the Lake County Commuter Coalition, who worked in collaboration with Metra to implement the "Sunrise Express" along the Union Pacific North Line. This new service used existing equipment and established a train departing Chicago at 5:42 a.m., so employees living in Chicago could arrive at their places of employment in Lake County by 7:00 a.m. This new service grew from 100 daily passengers to over 400 daily passengers today, with some daily usage at over 500 passengers. This regional alliance and collaboration between multiple public and private agencies has proven to be one of the most successful routes for Metra.

Currently there are 14 Amtrak trains that travel through Lake Forest; seven (7) southbound trains and seven (7) northbound trains. Based upon estimated customer demand, The City proposes the following stops at the Telegraph Road Station=

**Phase 1 Amtrak trains (beginning July 1, 2015):**

Southbound – Train 330, 340, 338, 332

Northbound – Train 339, 331, 337, 333

**Phase 2 Additional Amtrak trains (beginning July 1, 2016):**

Southbound – Train 334, 336, 342

Northbound – Train 329, 341

As you are aware, the City is making every effort to construct an underpass at the 911 Telegraph Road Train Station. We anticipate Phase 2 Engineering to be completed in December 2014 making the underpass project shovel ready for 2015. The City of Lake Forest is collaborating with multiple agencies to identify the additional funding sources in order to participate in the April 2015 IDOT bid letting.

The Lake County region and The City of Lake Forest appreciates your consideration of our request and would welcome the opportunity to meet with you and your staff to answer any questions you may have. The Lake County Transportation Alliance (LCTA) is a public-private partnership which seeks to build consensus around needed transportation improvements of all modes of transportation in Lake County. [www.lcta1.com](http://www.lcta1.com)

The Executive Committee of the LCTA received a copy of the attached Fact Sheet entitled "Lake County Amtrak Hiawatha Service Station Stop in Lake Forest." This proposed stop would be in west Lake Forest at Everett Rd and IL Rte 43.

Based on the Fact Sheet, some of the items discussed on this request were:

- What is the best location for a stop in Lake County? The station should have easy access to residents and businesses and available parking for the new users. Lake Cook Rd station was mentioned as a prototypical good example with both but not centralized in Lake County.
- Is Metra in support and would there be any disruptions to the existing Metra Milwaukee North commuter service?
- Any new stop should service all of Lake County. Gurnee has been talked about as a location for years.
- An existing Metra station stop should be used, e.g. Gurnee is north of the branch off of the Metra Milwaukee North commuter service to Fox Lake.
- There is no Amtrak stop in Lake County now.
- It was noted that there is no agency undertaking a comprehensive study nor is there any other municipality in Lake County undertaking such a study.

Therefore, the LCTA Executive Committee voted that I send a letter of support for an Amtrak Hiawatha Service Station Stop in west Lake Forest. We applaud the City of Lake Forest for completing preliminary work on the potential for an Amtrak station stop in Lake County and trust that the issues mention above be adequately reviewed.




